TOOL 1.1 GENDER EQUITY: TEST YOUR KNOWLEDGE OF WOMEN'S ECONOMIC STATUS AND EQUITY

Would you be surprised to learn that Latina women earn an average of only 60 percent of men's wages? Use this quiz in an orientation or information session to prompt awareness about the need for women to have access to jobs in traditionally higher-paid, male-dominated blue-collar careers. Or, use it to build the understanding and commitment of workforce development professionals to gender equity. This tool also contains a worksheet of common myths and facts that builds upon the quiz to address commonly misunderstood stereotypes.

This tool frames the action planning to increase the access to and success of women in nontraditional occupations. The answers to the quiz and the information on myths and realities are included as a separate sheet.

MYTHS AND FACTS SAMPLE RESPONSES

MYTH: Blue-collar work is nontraditional for women.

FACT: Many jobs now thought to be nontraditional for women have been performed by women in the past.

MYTH: Women are not strong enough to do heavy labor.

FACT: Many traditional women's jobs (e.g., nursing, waitressing) are just as physically demanding as some nontraditional jobs.

MYTH: Women won't like trades work.

FACT: Many tradeswomen report a high degree of job satisfaction.

MYTH: Women aren't interested in nontraditional jobs.

FACT: Women who haven't considered nontraditional jobs are often quite interested in exploring them once they are introduced to them.

MYTH: Women won't want to tolerate the working conditions in male-dominated blue-collar jobs.

FACT: Many women enjoy working with their hands and working outdoors.

MYTH: Women's family responsibilities will interfere with working conditions and the hours of nontraditional jobs.

FACT: Most working parents manage work and family responsibilities.
